## Coaching Expectations: Field Maintenance



## 1. Field Security and Maintenance

- a. All managers and coaches are expected to attend the annual pre-season field training
  - i. Coaches will be instructed and shown proper field care
  - ii. Instructed on proper opening and closing procedures
  - iii. Introduced to field maintenance equipment and proper use and storage
- b. Majors and AAA Managers will be assigned keys and combos to the James St and MacArthur facilities.
  - i. Keys must never be duplicated
  - ii. Keys must never be shared with anyone without prior approval of the Board of Directors or Level Coordinator
  - iii. It is the responsibility of team managers to ensure the facilities are locked and secure after every use
    - 1. Storage trailers/bins
    - 2. Concession stand
    - 3. Batting cage
    - 4. Dumpster
    - 5. Portable toilet
- c. All managers and coaches are expected to help maintain the playing fields
  - i. Uncover pitcher's mound and home plate
  - ii. Bases and anchor plates are removed and stored following every use
  - iii. Base holes are plugged after every use
  - iv. Rake/Drag and groom all dirt playing surfaces Before and After every use (See attached Diagram)
    - 1. Always rake/drag with basepaths; Never across
    - Always rake towards the pitcher's plate and homeplate; Never away
      - a. Fill and repair any holes created while playing
    - 3. Keep rake/drag 6-8 inches away from infield grass
      - a. Prevents dangerous lips from forming on the infield grass
    - 4. Pull dirt toward the bases to prevent gullies from forming around high traffic areas
  - v. Pitcher's mound and Home Plate must be covered after every use
  - vi. Failure to maintain fields could result in:
    - 1. Letter of reprimand
    - 2. Suspension from coaching
    - 3. Removal from coaching

- d. AA, A and Tee Ball Managers will be given the combinations to the equipment storage bins at the Welch/O'Connor B and Carroll Savage playing fields
  - Lock combinations must never be shared with anyone that is not associated with Peabody Little League
  - ii. It is the responsibility of team managers to ensure;
    - All league equipment is properly cared for and returned to the storage bin
      - a. Catcher's equipment
        - Must organized and returned to supplied equipment bag before being placed in the storage bin
      - b. Bat racks
      - c. Bases and anchors
      - d. Shared practice and game balls
      - e. Jr Umpire protective gear(Carroll Savage)
    - 2. Bases and anchor plates are removed after every use(Carroll Savage)
      - a. Welch/O'Connor B uses temporary, non anchored bases
    - 3. Base holes are plugged after every use(Carroll Savage)
    - 4. Storage bin is locked and secure after every use
    - 5. Notify Level Coordinator if;
      - a. Any equipment is missing
      - b. First-aid kits need restocking

## How to Properly Rake and Drag Infield

Proper raking and dragging techniques help to reduce the formation of a grass lip on the infield edge:

- Always rake with a grass edge not into it, and avoid pulling infield material into the grass edge
- · When dragging the infield stay at least six inches away from the grass edge
- Hand screen drag on the infield skin and warning track, and a hand rake on baselines, infield cutouts, pitching mound, and home plate
- Do not allow players or other kids to use drags
